Below are some places and events that offer either free or discounted ways of keeping the children entertained during the holidays.

Take part in a ParkrunParkruns are free 5km runs which take place everySaturday morning at 9am. With a wooden ship climbing frameset in a sand-filled playground, as well as a fun splash area, there is plenty to keep any little ones entertained.

Meet the animals at Crystal Palace Park Farm Here you can meet animals such as goats, chickens, Shetland ponies, pigs, rabbits and guinea pigs and handle snakes and lizards in the exotics room for free. It's open from noon to 4pm daily except Wednesdays. Explore RISE Gallery (St George's Walk, Croydon) This trendy gallery is free during the day and puts on free evening events. Take a trip to see its collection of contemporary, urban contemporary, and post war-pop art. Just don't try and go on a Monday as it's not open!	Pistachios in the Park (Banstead) The soft-play is FREE for one hour per child when you spend over £5 in the cafe, otherwise, its £2 per child per hour. For two children, they ask you to spend over £10 or pay £2 for your extra child. This park is a short 166 bus ride from Chipstead Valley Road.
Play Basketball Don't bother paying for sports! Head to one of Croydon's parks, including South Norwood Lake and Grounds, Upper Norwood Recreation Ground, Selsdon Recreation Ground and Rickman Hill, and you'll find basketball courts where you can play for free.	See supercars at Mercedes-Benz World (Weybridge) Be dazzled by super fast cars on the race track and take a look at vintage vehicles inside the museum at Mercedes- Benz World. It is free to wander around the displays, have a go at the interactive games and pick up motor merchandise from the gift shop. Open seven days a week.
Oxygen Trampoline Park (Purley Way) The 30-Day Pass allows you to visit the trampolines for 30 consecutive days. It costs £35, however one session would normally cost around £12.
