Cadbury's Bournville

Bournville is a village situated in Birmingham, England and is the site of Cadbury's famous chocolate factory.

It was established by Richard and George Cadbury in the late 19th century. The two brothers were Victorian businessmen with a social conscience.

George was married to Elizabeth and they were both involved in the planning of the Bournville factory.

George, in particular, was very interested in improving the working and living conditions of his workers and set about building houses for his employees.


Over the years many of the buildings have been preserved and form 'The Bournville Village Trust'. The Trust is still in operation today, building and carrying on the good work of George Cadbury.

Cadbury's began as a small family business and is now thought to be one of the World's largest chocolate producers. The factory is in operation 24 hours a day, seven days a week and only closes on Christmas Day. The employees work 12-hour shifts.

Some of the most popular chocolate produced at Cadbury's is the Dairy Milk bar and the chocolate Creme Egg. The chocolate crème egg is said to be the fastest selling chocolate bar in the run up to Easter. Just recently Cadbury's produced the chocolate crème egg bar.

Chocolate comes from the 'theobroma' cacao tree, (the cocoa plant) which translated into Greek means 'food of the gods'!
