
Today's focus is on comprehension and word meaning!



Expanded Noun Phrase
An expanded noun phrase is a phrase made up of a noun and at least one adjective. If you list more than one adjective to describe the noun, you should add a comma to separate them.

Expanded Noun Phrase

lots of yummy, cold ice cream

Noun
A person, object or animal:
garage, Henry, leopard, sofa.

Adjective
A word that describes a noun:
monstrous, vivid, delightful, familiar.

Determiner
Used to introduce a noun to specify which one or how many: a/an, the, three, most.

Expanded Noun Phrase
A phrase that gives more detail and description about a noun.
