<p>Lesson 2</p>	<p>Listen to the story Croc and bird by Alex Deacon https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eoL-nbvmF1A</p> <p>Answer the questions below in your book.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Why do you think bird suggests to crocodile that they should open their mouths as wide as they can and wait for food to come?2. What did bird and crocodile practice doing together?3. Do you think birds and crocodiles can be friends and live together? Why? Explain. <p>Write your answers in your book.</p>	<p>Remember to answer in complete sentences using capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and neat handwriting.</p>

Lesson 3	<p>Listen to the story again up to the point where croc says "I'm hungry".</p> <p>What do you know about birds and crocodiles? What do they look like? What do they eat? Where would you find them? How do they sleep? What do they do?</p> <p>Can you research and find some facts on the internet about these two animals? (bird is based on a blue parrot).</p> <p>Make a poster about one of the animals (or both if you want to).</p> <p>Extension: Make a fact file about the animals using headings, subheadings, pictures/drawings etc.</p>		
Lesson 4	<p>How does Bird's part of the 'world' look in comparison to Croc's? Bird's side of the page is bare, empty, open and without a great deal of colour, Croc's part is full of wonder texture and colour, full of plants, animals, leaves and fruits.</p> <p>How do you think both characters are feeling at this moment? Do you think they feel the same? Like they have before when they were hungry, or different? What do you think each character might be thinking to themselves at this time?</p> <p>Make a comparison in your book.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Croc</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;">In this part write about the crocodile.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Bird</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;">In this part write about the bird.</p>
Lesson 5	<p>At the end of the story Bird and Croc are together again. What do you think will happen next? Will they stay together or will they go back to their own kind?</p>
