Vaisakhi is celebrated the founding of the guru in 1699 that's the Sikh community.

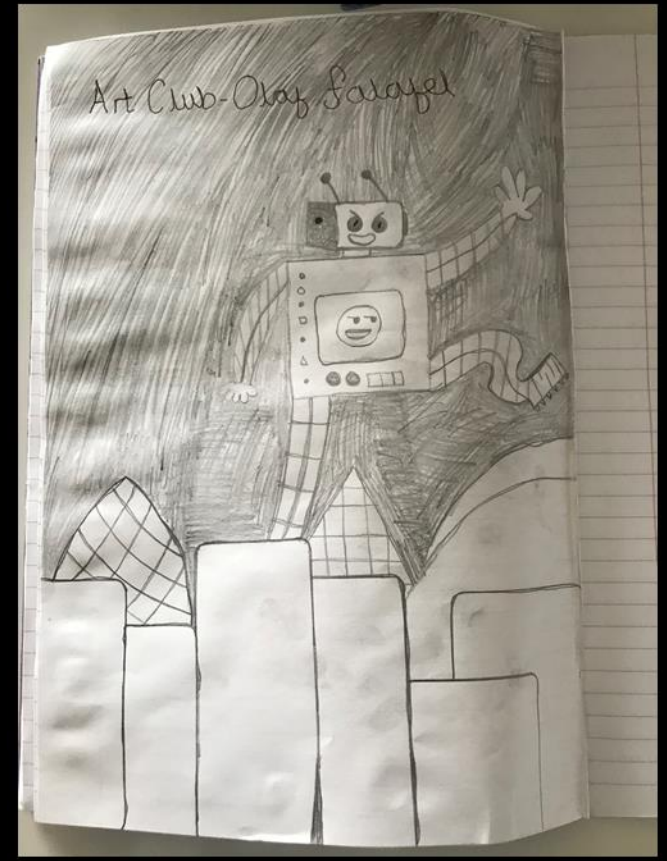

The pang piara were the first five members of the Sikh community. These give people volentiered to die for their religion. But they ended up not dying.

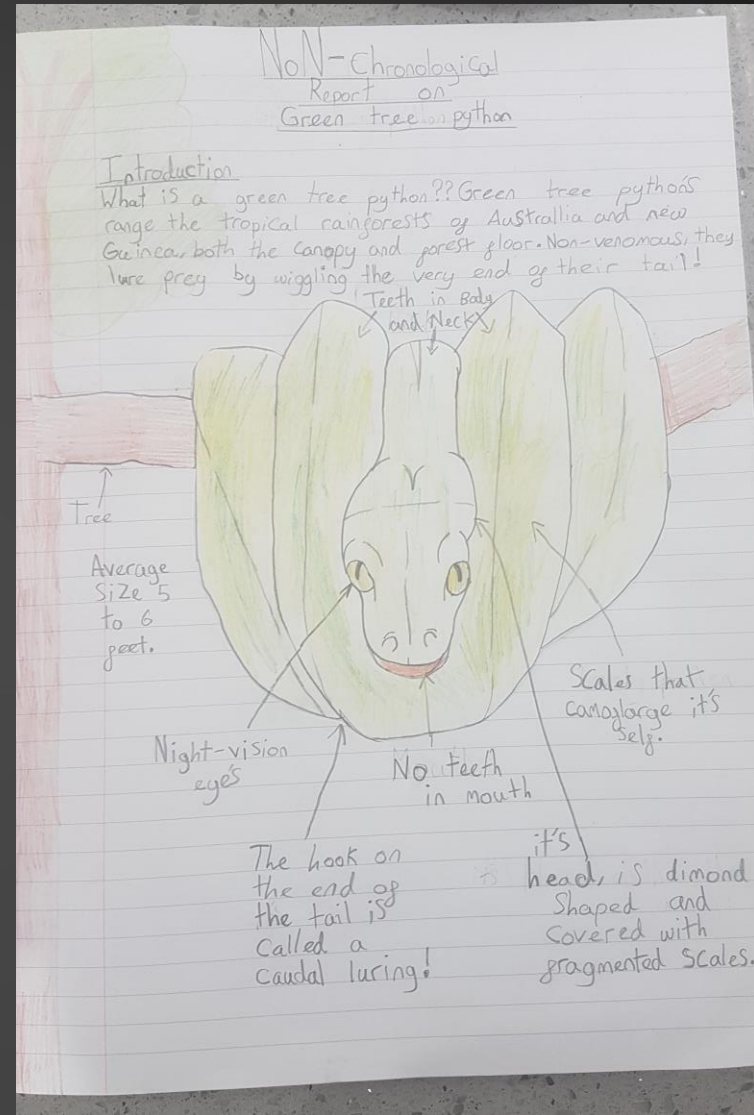

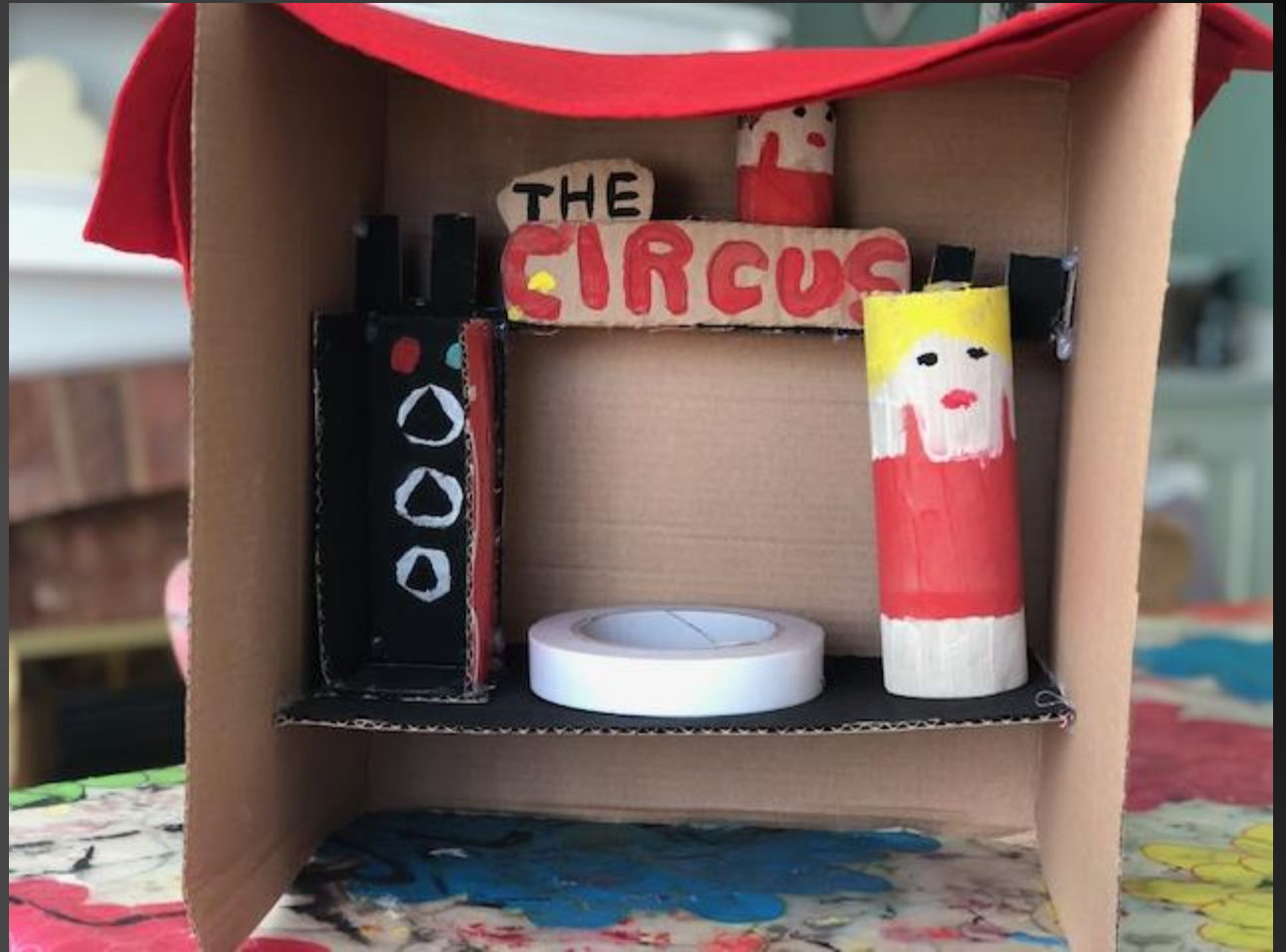
