Main clauses and subordinate clauses

- A main clause has a subject and a verb. It makes sense on its own.
- A subordinate clause gives extra information but it doesn't make sense on its own.



I used to live in Paris, where I worked as a teacher.


A Midsummer Night's Dream by William Shakespeare

"You must marry Demetrius! He's kind, and he


loves you," Egeus ordered.

Jealous Helena trailed behind them.
