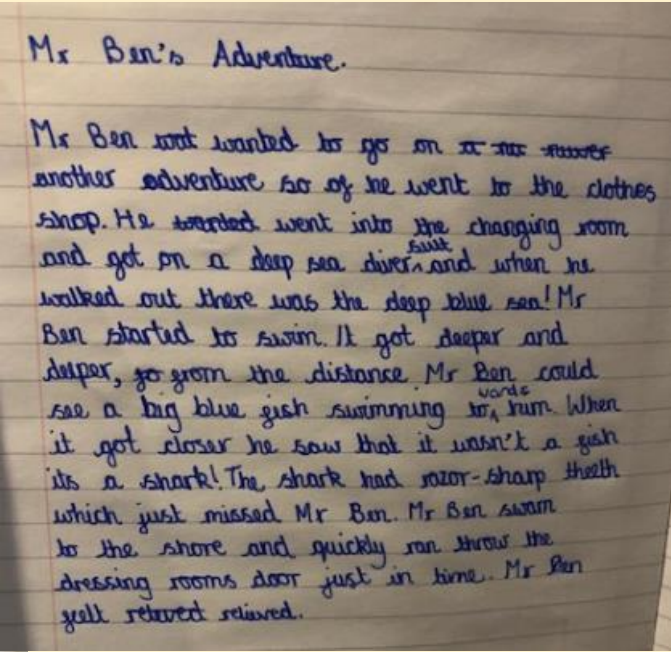
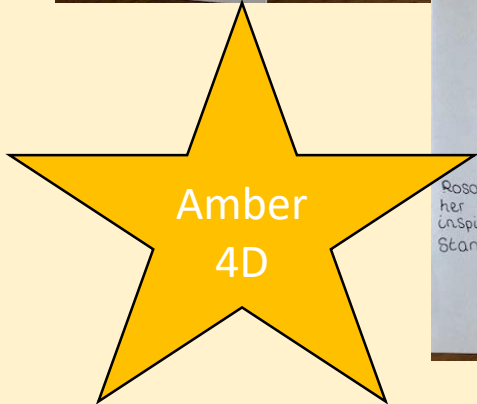
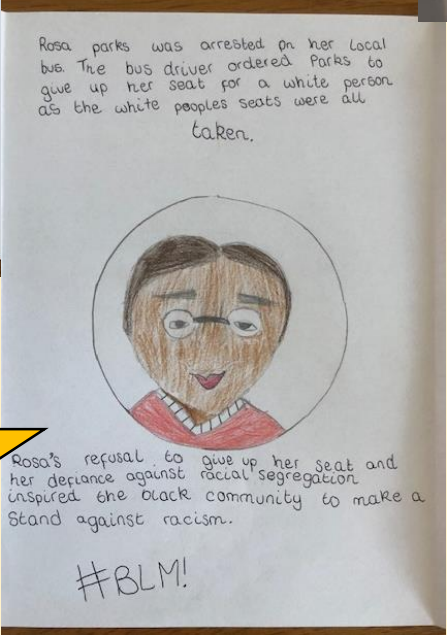

Family life in WW2



This is my Granny's flag which she hung out of her window at the end of ww2 on VE day. This is my Granny's toy panda she had with her during the war. When she got it she thought it was a dog so she named it Bowwow but as she grew older she realised it was a panda, not a dog.

My Granny was 2 years old when the war started. She said, "I couldn't imagine life without a war on." she also said, "I didn't know what a banana was until I was 7 years old."

Granny was evacuated to Basingstoke and she had a Mickey Mouse gas mask. Fortunately she never had to use it. Granny had a Morrison shelter.

My Papa was 9 years old when the war started. He was evacuated to a farm house in Devon with his family. He didn't want to be evacuated with his family, he wanted to go with his school. Papa went to a school in Devon and he had to walk three miles each way to and from school.

Papa moved back to south London at the time when the Doodlebugs were attacking. Papa could tell the difference between the engine sound of an Allies' plane and an Axis' plane. He said he saw a Doodlebug from his back garden. Papa said the doodlebugs were very frightening. There was a two minutes to wait, after the engine cut out, and the explosion.

Papa had a Morrison shelter like Granny did. Morrison shelters are built under the table and the whole family has to sleep there. Papa said that he had a big table so it was easy to fit the whole family in. A Morrison shelter is built with wire round the edge of it, so it is more secure. Morrison shelters are under the table because if the house gets bombed the table will hold the weight of the house. If that does happen you will have to get dug out.

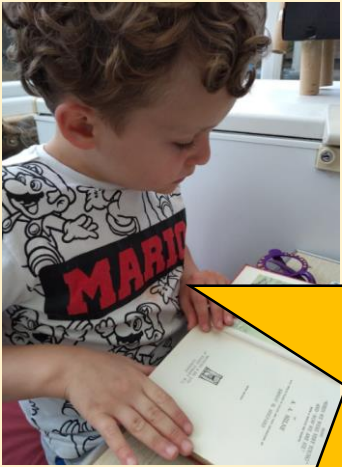
