#### Foreword






#### Dear family,


#### How is the image of a kitchen different to your kitchen?


#### What do you have that is the same but different?



#### New Zealand in the 1980s

#### Social

During the 1980s, the population rose to 3.4 million. Of this amount, 2.5 million lived in the North Island. The average family size included only 2 children. There was more migration from Asia, which meant that more New Zealanders were being exposed to a wider range of cuisine. The microwave oven came into the markets for the first time and cost the equivalent of \$1500 nowadays.
