

Maths links:

Children will continue to develop their mathematical skills with the focus being on these topics: Fractions (focusing on fractions on a number line and fractions of a number) and Time (focusing on both digital and analogue clocks as well as reading timetables).

English links:

This half term, we will be looking at poetry based on the book, The Tin Forest. Children will be using a range of descriptive language to create their own free verse poems.

We will then be looking at Leon and the Place Between. Children will be using their skills to write a newsletter, make a persuasive posters and taking a look at story mapping to create their own

PE: Dance:

- Children will be looking at moving to different beats.
- To link dance movements to form a sequence.
- To work in groups to combine and perform a dance.

We will also be doing weekly Tennis lessons leading up to a match, looking at ball control, backhand and forehand.



PHSE / Values:

Children will be looking at who keeps us safe and how we look after living things.

MFL / International:

In Spanish this term, we will be looking at fruit, vegetables and breakfast foods.

History:

In this theme children will have the opportunity to look at the history of Chipstead and Coulsdon.

Key objectives include:

- To order and sequence several events within the area
- Use evidence to describe the culture, leisure and way of life.
- Use evidence describe historical buildings and their uses.

Computing:

Children will be given the opportunity to publish their written word using word and PowerPoint.

Art - Colour:

We will be continuing to develop an understanding of how to use the colour wheel to find contrasting colours. Document colour mixing - analyse and annotate and use different mediums to experiment with background washes.
