Maths: The children will be continuing to consolidate their fluency skills, whilst developing their reasoning and problem-solving skills. The children will be focusing on enhancing their understanding of fractions and decimals.


English: Children will be writing their own poetry based on the book 'Werewolf Club Rules'. After this, they will be looking into writing their own newspaper report, autobiographies and a story related to our topic 'Ancient Egypt'.

MFL / global links: In Spanish, the children will be learning how to discuss different items of clothing.

Art: We will be dedicating a whole day to Egyptian art, where the children will be taking part in a carousel of activities. They will have the opportunity to use colour for purpose and to develop their brush strokes. The children will also discuss and understand the cultural and historical importance of pattern.

Computing: In our computing lessons, the children will be continuing to develop their understanding of the Scratch software.

Music: Year 4 will be continuing to work on keyboards and developing the skill to read and play from the treble and bass clef.

The Well-being curriculum:
The children will be learning about
the effect that we have on our
environment and how to look after it.
We will develop the children's
understanding of the importance of

Science: This term the children will be learning about living things and their habitats. We will be visiting the ducks and our surrounding grounds to enhance the children's understanding of classification. The children will also carry out an investigation on how the environment can pose dangers to living things.

PE: The children will be focusing on netball this term.

History: The children will be exploring ancient Egypt this term. We will introduce the children to the idea of empathy through a study of Egyptian's behaviour, characteristics and beliefs. We will also use evidence from a range of sources to reconstruct Egyptian life. We will draw conclusions and compare Egyptian life to the modern day.
