
We honoured our amazing Queen's death with each class creating silhouette collages, using either paint or paper and glue, which we have displayed on the playground fence for

Reception

We have welcomed our new reception children into full time school this month, the children settled in beautifully and have made lots of new friends and learnt lots of new skills already. We have been thinking about ourselves and the children have even done their first show and tell session, talking about an object that is special to them. We have talked about what we look like and have painted our own portrait.

The children have been spending a lot of time practising recognising and writing their name and getting themselves dressed for PE. This is something we will continue to practise. We had our first trip to the library and we enjoyed listening to a story. This week we will be choosing a book to share at home with you which could mean looking at the pictures or for you to read together.

Reception team are looking forward to Fresh Air Fridays, this will be an opportunity for the children to explore the grounds and our beautiful surroundings. This we will be taking place every Friday come rain or shine, so please make sure they have the appropriate clothing and footwear, so the children can make the most of this experience.





Key Stage 1 Update

Year 1

The children have settled into year 1 brilliantly and are continuing to familiarise themselves with the year 1 routine. This term, our topic is 'All about me' and we have been exploring our senses using the schools grounds. We went on a senses hunt where we discussed what we could hear, see and touch. We have also linked our topic to our English learning, where we have been using labels to label parts of the human body and our faces. We kicked off our maths learning with some different maths investigations, which the children loved. We are very much looking forward to watching the children grow across this academic year.





Year 2

Throughout September, Year 2 made a fantastic start to this academic year. They have settled into school incredibly well and have made us all so proud.

Throughout the first few weeks, the children were focusing on an array of activities, based on an exciting interpretation of the traditional tale 'The Princess and the Pea. The children used the school grounds when retelling the story by acting out scenes in small groups. This then really helped them when they needed to retell the story in their own words in their English books. We were all blown away with how hard they worked and how much effort they put into their final stories, using exciting adjectives and lovely story language!

In addition to this, the children have been recapping their place value skills. They have been understanding how many tens and ones in a two-digit number. They have made a great start with this and we will continue to practice this throughout the academic year.

Within our Discovery lessons, the children have been focusing on Science. We have looked at our variety of materials and learned about their properties. This is going to lead to some very exciting learning linked to the Great Fire of London where they will be building replica Tudor houses and discovering what makes them flammable, watch this space!

Key Stage 2 Update

Year 3

Welcome to Year 3! The children have started the new school year with a thirst to learn and lots of enthusiasm. During the first week, we completed various activities which involved getting to know them. In English, we looked at the book "Princess and the Pea", which was set in Africa. The children retold the story in their own words. We have now moved on to looking at explanation texts and how the Romans built their magnificent straight roads. The children were excited to become historians in the Digiverse and made notes on their findings.

In maths, we have been focusing on numbers up to 1000 and have enjoyed working outside creating 3-digit numbers with natural resources. The children have also been looking at the value of each digit. Over the next week, we will be comparing and ordering numbers to 1000. As mathematicians, they have been using different resources to create numbers and have also been carrying out various investigations.





'Romans' is our current topic in history and we have been amazed at the knowledge some of the children have. As part of our learning, we went into the Digiverse to learn about the location of Italy within Europe. In history, they have researched the daily life of a Roman and presented their findings to the class.

Finally, in Spanish we have started the new year introducing ourselves and we will also be celebrating European Day of Languages, which falls on 26th September.

Year 4

To kick start this school year, the children took part in "Learning to Learn" week. We thought about what makes a good learner and reminded ourselves about school life. The children practised their presentation as well as handwriting, to ensure our work throughout the year is presented beautifully. We are so impressed with how the children have settled into Year 4!

In English, Year 4 have really enjoyed the story "Quill Soup". We have made predictions about the book and then shared it as a class. The children are writing their own version of the tale using their own characters.

Within our Maths, the children have been practising their place value skills and have also done some journaling as part of this. They have really enjoyed using practical resources, such as dienes and place value counters to secure their understanding of number.

During our wellbeing sessions, we have explored what makes a good learner and classmate. We also took some time to reflect on the passing of Queen Elizabeth II. The children were very keen to learn more about the work and life of our Queen. Many brought in objects such as crowns, flags and stamps to celebrate her life within our classroom.

As part of our Tudor topic, the children have made their own Tudor collaged roses to display in the classroom. They have also begun to understand chronological order and used a timetable to place areas of Tudor history into order.


Keep up the super work Year 4 and we are looking forward to seeing your Discovery home learning!

Year 5

Since beginning the new school year, Year 5 made a fantastic start. They have settled back into school life and have made us incredibly proud.

Throughout the first few weeks, we have been basing our English learning around the book, "Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters". The story explains how 2 sisters, with very different personalities, travel to become the Kings wife. As part of this Year 5 were working towards writing a re-tell of a section of the book. They created setting descriptions using high level vocabulary and practiced embedding speech within their sentences. Alongside writing, the book also inspired our art. We used the technique sgraffito, to create beautiful African patterns.







In addition to this, the children have been recapping their place value skills. They have been

understanding the different value each digit has and writing numbers to one million. Year 5 have also started taking part in some exciting maths investigations as well as outdoor learning.

The children in Year 5 have enjoyed taking part in Wellbeing sessions where we have thought about "What makes a good learner?" and "What makes a good classmate?"

Well done Year 5 for all your hard work so far!





Year 6

In their first month of Year 6, the children have settled in well and have demonstrated a good work ethic.

We started English off with looking at Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters, focusing on descriptive writing through activities such as role on the wall which allowed them to complete setting and character descriptions using a variety of descriptive devices. We have now moved on to narrative poetry. In Science, we have begun our topic Animals including humans and have investigated the circulatory system and the heart aided by the Digiverse and the dissection of a lamb's heart; the children found this enjoyable and engaging.

For our Discovery topic, we are looking at Early Islamic Civilisation and have so far learned about the importance of Baghdad as it was a cultural hub, as well as making comparisons between the Golden Age of Islam and the Dark Ages that occurred in Europe during this time. We have also compared the Islamic and Christian creation stories in RE.
