

## Chipstead Valley Primary School

### PE and Sports Premium Funding

In the academic year 2021 – 2022, Chipstead Valley Primary received £21,410 in addition to a 2020-2021 carry forward of £9114.59.

The table below shows how this funding was spent:

Amount	Spent On	Impact
<b>£15,650.47</b>	<b>New equipment</b> was bought to create an outside gym area to enhance PE lessons and to ensure children are offered a range of experiences to keep them fit and healthy in adjacent to PE lesson taught. In addition, money was spent on equipment to be used in lessons to provide high quality lessons.	The new outdoor equipment and area has allowed children additional opportunities to use gym equipment and take part in circuits to improve fitness. This has added to the opportunities children have for fitness sessions within the timetable and has created enthusiasm for fitness and leading a healthy lifestyle.
<b>£10,749.82</b>	<b>Additional Swimming</b> – part funding of additional swimming provision for all years groups	All children from year 1 to year 5 take part in weekly swimming lessons enabling a very high proportion of children to not only meet but also exceed the 25 metre primary swimming target. A high percentage of children are additionally able to access competitive swimming.
<b>£4125.00</b>	<b>Sports Coaching</b> - funded specialist coach to develop increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport	Teacher confidence increased and improved level of PE teaching and sports provision throughout the school
