PE and Sports Premium Funding

In the academic year 2022 – 2023, Chipstead Valley Primary received £21,320.

The table below shows how this funding was spent:

£1632.06	Netball uniform and equipment- A new kit has been bought for those representing the school to help with team morale. Equipment has been bought for use in the playground and for the use in class.	The children represent the school regularly at tournaments, competitions and matches. Wearing matching uniform gives them a sense of pride and belonging. Having the equipment readily available for teaching ensures that all children are included and gives them the opportunity to thrive.
£768	PE Scheme- Introducing a new scheme for all teaching staff to be able to follow, to ensure consistency across the school.	This is the introduction of a holistic, well-rounded and detailed scheme for PE to ensure that PE is enjoyable for all pupils. The scheme will teach the fundamentals that all children will need to apply to a range of sports. The scheme also provides a solid progression of knowledge, skills and understanding in line with the National Curriculum as well as providing essential CPD for all staff.
£14,413	Additional Swimming – part funding of additional swimming provision for all years groups.	All children from year 1 to year 6 take part in weekly swimming lessons enabling a very high proportion of children to not only meet but also exceed the 25 metre primary swimming target. A high percentage of children are additionally able to access competitive swimming.
£4125.00	Sports Coaching - funded specialist coaches to develop increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.	Teacher confidence increased and improved level of PE teaching and sports provision throughout the school
£381	Sports Competition – allowing children to represent their school in a range of sports.	Children are taught a vast range of sports and a wide range of children are chosen to

		represent the school. Promoting confidence and self-esteem.
