

## **EYFS Update**

#### **Nursery**

Our first topic this half term was 'Autumn, Colour and Light' and within this theme, we looked at the Hindu festival of Diwali and learnt about the story of Sita and Rama and that good defeats evil. We created rangoli patterns from sand and glitter and made diva lamps from clay.

We also looked at the land and nature artist Andy Goldsworthy and created patterns out of leaves, sticks and stones, drawing on his famous works as inspriation.

We visited the Digiverse to look at fireworks in 3D, made firework explosive pictures from metallic paint and created arrangements with shapes on our light box. We talked about onomatopoeic words for firework sounds such as bang, sizzle and woosh.











Next, we looked at 'Being Healthy' and talked about exercise and healthy eating and had a fun PE session with Mr Thompson in the hall, which the children adored! We also discussed oral hygiene and the importance of cleaning our teeth.

The final topic for this half term was 'Winter and Christmas'. We had lots of fun role-playing with Olaf and Sven in the Winter Igloo and experimented with winter animals that had been frozen and using shared thinking with our peers to free the animals trapped in the ice!

On 1<sup>st</sup> December, the children were delighted to see the arrival of the cheeky elves Eli and Esme. They have been up to so much mischief each night in Nursery and the children could not wait to find out what they have been up to when they arrived each morning!

We were busy practicing our Christmas singalong songs, which the children preformed beautifully to their important adults. We learnt about the story of the First Christmas and the baby Jesus and why we give and receive presents at this time of year. We were also lucky enough to watch Reception's nativity play.

We have also participated in created a wide variety of Christmas craft projects, making items for the Winter Bazaar and had a go at making hats, cards, baubles, Christmas angels and snowflakes to practice our fine motor ability.

#### **Reception**

The children have worked extremely hard this half term and have fully settled into school. The children are confident with the routines, especially with Phonics and Mastering Number. They have developed relationships with their peers and are beginning to work collaboratively with some tasks. This was also extremely evident in our fantastic Nativity called 'Barmy Bethlehem', where they supported one another with their lines and feeling confident to get onto the stage. We are so proud of all the children and feel they have all developed their resilience towards new experiences.

Over the past few weeks, we have looked at lots of Autumnal and Winter stories. These stories were Pumpkin Soup, Leaf Man and Stick Man. We have done many great learning activities linked with these stories. The children really loved creating their own Stick Man/Lady and writing about all the different things he or she saw on their journey! The children have made great progress with Phonics and are beginning to read and write CVC words. They are beginning to learn 'red words' and are learning these through songs. Most of the children in Reception are now able to independently write their names. We are still working hard to ensure the children are forming the letters using the correct formation and with an appropriate size.

In maths, the children can confidently subitise numbers to 5 and are starting to compose them in different ways. Through the support of morning work, the children are now more confident with writing numerals







to 10 and are beginning to recognise and order numerals to 10. Next half term, we will be expanding our knowledge of the composition of numerals to 10 and the children will begin to learn more number bond knowledge. Well done to all the children in Reception, you all deserve a good rest as you have worked so hard. We look forward to all the fantastic learning in Spring term.

#### **Treehouse**

Treehouse children have been so busy with their learning. In English we have been reading a story called 'The Snowman'. The children then made Snowmen Christmas cards from the story. We have also had our carol concert. The children practised so hard and were amazing with their singing and their signing, especially in front of so many people in the church.



## **Key Stage 1 Update**

#### Year 1

Can you believe another half term has passed?! The Year 1 children have worked extremely hard in the lead up to Christmas and we are so proud of them. Our topic this term has been 'Brilliant Britain' where the children learnt the continents of the world, countries that make up the UK and exploring the town of Banstead. We travelled on the 166 bus to look at the different parts of the town and the amenities it has. They have also loved our computing lessons on replicating artists' work on the Paintz app.

In our English lessons, we have retold the story of Handa's Surprise. The children learnt the actions and remembered them in order to tell the story in chronological order. They did a great job! Later on, we made a jam sandwich and wrote instructions to tell someone else how to make it. We were blown away at the number of adjectives the children used to describe the butter, jam, break and knife.

In maths, we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and what makes them different. We went on a shape hunt around school to identify different shapes in reality. We leant about sides and corners for 2D shapes as well as faces, edges and vertices for 3D shapes. We even made 3D shapes with spaghetti and marshmallows.

We'd like to say a massive well done to all of the Year 1 children for their hard work in the lead up to the Christmas Carol Concert at the church. It's a tough job learning the words to multiple songs at once and we couldn't be prouder of the performance they gave! We hope that the children have a well-deserved, restful Christmas break and we cannot wait for the fun to continue in the new year!





#### Year 2

In the final few weeks of the term, the children worked very hard on planning, designing and making the flapjacks for the Christmas Bazaar as well as performing in the Year 1, 2 and 3 Christmas Carol Concert. Both events were the perfect way to kick start the festive season, we hope you all felt the same!

In maths, the children have been finishing off addition and moving onto to subtraction on a number line using ones and tens. They have also started to recap money; we have been using coins to shop in Santa's Grotto!

In English, the children wrote their own versions of Mr Wolf's pancakes. We created our own characters such as Mr T-Rex, Mr Tarantula, Miss Bunny and Mrs Leopard. We are so impressed with the stories the children have written, using a variety of punctuation and their own imaginative adjectives to make it exciting! We then created our own Winter Acrostic Poems linking to the festive season.







We have thoroughly enjoyed the first term in Year 2 and the children have been brilliant; they have settled in and are making great progress. We have so much to look forward to in 2024: lots of outdoor learning, 2 trips and a Year 2 end of year production!

# **Key Stage 2 Update**

#### Year 3

How can it already be the end of the autumn term? The children have settled into year 3 fantastically, we are so proud of them!

In maths this term, we completed addition and subtraction. The children mastered the column method and are now able to apply this method to solve word problems. After this, we started to look at multiplication and division and we have learnt how to

multiply and divide by 10 and 100. As part of our outdoor learning, we used natural resources to make our own arrays. This week, we completed an investigation on favourite chocolates in celebration boxes.


In English, we started off with poetry with a focus on autumn. The children wrote three amazing poems using lots of poetic devices. We then began to use 'Icky Doo Dah: The Royal Bling' as our stimulus. From this text, we wrote our own adventure stories and completed a set of instructions on how to draw Icky Doo Dah. We were wowed by their ability to structure their own stories and then even began to use fronted adverbials to link their paragraphs.

In science, we finished our unit on light where we carried out an investigation exploring how the size of a shadow changes. Towards the end of this term, we started our new topic on forces and magnets. The children have carried out an investigation exploring the role of friction.

This term, the children have been focusing on completing their own animations on iPads. We have been amazed by their ability to create an animation from their own storyboards!

In November, we had our annual Christmas Bazaar and the children made a fun and festive product which sold out within 25 minutes!

On the last week of term, we had a silent gallery to showcase the children's excellent history homework. We were thoroughly impressed with their creativity and we look forward to seeing what they manage to make in our next history topic: Through the Ages.











Finally, the children did a fantastic job at the Carol concert, particularly those who were readers. We were very proud of all of them!

#### Year 4

During the autumn term, Year 4 have been well and truly engrossed into their, 'Terrifying Tudor' topic. During Autumn 2, we all had a fantastic trip to Hampton Court. The children absolutely loved exploring King Henry VIII's Palace and grounds.

In addition to our wonderful trip, Year 4 have also been learning about Christianity this half term. We explored the Nativity story, made Christingles and learnt all about the different symbols, that represent Christianity.

In maths, we have been multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 & 1000. We then linked this to our learning all about converting centimetres to metres and metres to kilometres. During English lessons, we have linked a lot of our learning to our history and RE topics. We have also written recounts and sets of instructions.

We have been very impressed with the large amount of 'Discovery' homework that has come in and the children have loved seeing each other's projects. Well done Year 4! Keep up the hard work!



Throughout this half term, Year 5 have been working incredibly hard in all subjects. Within English, they have been basing their writing on the film 'Coco' and they have produced some amazing pieces of work. They were able to see the Traditional Mexican Day of the Dead celebrations come to life in the Digiverse.

In addition to this, children have been working on their addition and subtraction by using the column method. They have been learning about area and perimeter, where they were able to complete their own investigation on perimeter.

Within science, children have been continuing to learn about forces and in November, they were able to visit the Science Museum and see some of this learning in a different environment.

In geography this term, Year 5 have been using atlases to learn all about the geographical features of Mexico, for example looking at mountain areas, population and the climate differences within Mexico!

#### **Visit to Woodmansterne Baptist Church**

The children were able to look around the Christian place of worship and were able to ask lots of questions about the Christmas story and how it supports Christian understanding of Jesus.









#### **Tim Burton Portraiture**

The children have been developing their understanding of different methods for creating light and dark tones. We researched techniques used by illustrator and director Tim Burton and had a go at creating some self-portraits using his style. We created some rules to follow and then used our own creative ideas to enhance the portraits. We think you'll agree that they look spook-tacular!

#### **Computing**

The children have had the opportunity to create their own websites in computing lessons this half term. They have designed and produced the websites on google slides about a subject of their choice. They have developed skills in inserting images, creating links and creating content. We are really proud of their progress!

#### **Creative Writing**

The children have been learning how to create suspense and tension in their writing. They have used flashbacks and a range of features to create atmosphere. First, they wrote about a girl called Alma, who became trapped inside a doll for life and then about the amazing story of Aron Ralston, whose arm was trapped by a boulder in Blue-John Canyon for 127 hours! All the children have done a great job!
