1. Welcome/ Members Introduction

3. Treasurers Report

The Disco was a great success and hugely enjoyed by the children. Thank you to all parents who helped in the run up and on the night! Feedback regarding the Rec/ Year 1 Disco was very positive and having the additional DJ session with the children gave the disco a more structured feel.

We need to make sure that we order more sweets for the next disco as we ran out. Katie to set date for October 2024 and book DJ. **SEE ACTION POINTS**

5. Pantomime Update (Jody Tranter)

The Harlequin Redhill have confirmed that they are not hosting a pantomime this year as their theatre is still closed. We discussed whether to enquire about other venues and everyone agreed that it was worth enquiring about availability and group discounts at Fairfield Halls, Dorking and Epsom. **SEE ACTION POINTS.**

6. Bag2School Update (Laura McBride)

Laura confirmed that the information email is due to go out to parents. Collection date is booked for Wednesday 8 May, with the actual donation day for parents on Tuesday 7 May. School have confirmed that they are still looking at a recycling scheme and have

asked that we book a further Bag2School collection for November 2024. **SEE ACTION POINTS.**

7. Fireworks (Sunday 3 November) Update (lan jones)

All organisation is going to plan and running to time. The actual display is booked, as is the safety fencing and toilets. Shelly updated that she had had a conversation earlier in the day with our Firework provider and they mentioned that they have a lot of safety fencing that they would be willing to sell to us. The meeting agreed to follow up on this and discuss once we have a price. **SEE ACTION POINTS.**

8. Colour Run (Julia Orr)

After much debate, we have agreed to combine the Colour Run in with our new Summer Fun Evening.

Packages include, basic package (£3.40), Mid package (£4.27 includes sunglasses) and Gold Package (£6.30 includes glasses and t-shirt). Numbers of participants need to be confirmed 10 days before the event. Clare to discuss route and date with SLT. **SEE ACTION POINTS.**

9. AGM 2024 (Shelly Rowe)

This year we have agreed to hold our AGM at the start of our next ordinary PTFA meeting. Shelly will send out all information to parents in advance of this. **SEE ACTION POINTS.**

10. Summer Fair Discussion (Clare Rackham)

The results of the Summer Fair – Parents View survey were shared and discussed. These can be seen below. Thank you to all parents who took the time to respond to this survey and to leave comments.

Lots of conversation took place about options and finally it was agreed that instead of an afternoon Summer Fair on a Saturday, we would hold a Summer Fun Evening event on a Friday, incorporating the Colour Run. Laura, Katie, Vicky, Heather and Eddie have very kindly offered to organise this, with Julia organising the Colour Run. This would also incorporate a BBQ, Pimms Stall and various game stalls, tombolas. Date is being set, but initial plans and ideas are underway! **SEE ACTION POINTS.**

11. PTFA Section Of CVPS Website (Clare Rackham)

Clare noted that the PTFA section of the school website was in need of an update and was looking a little blank and requested if it was possible to provide some more information to parents about the PTFA, how we work and how this incorporated the school Vision etc.

- Happy to join PTFA but unsure how to apply
- The kids love the fair so would be a shame not to have one
- I think if the summer fair is too grand, scaling things back and focusing just on the school community rather than the wider community would be good. I appreciate that you may make more money from opening events up to the wider community, but it also likely increases the workload. Maybe having 1 or 2 lower key events, or something that could be facilitated by an external company would be good, and ease the pressure on the few who organise these. Thanks for everything you do.
- We need more volunteers
- The Summer fair is a huge event for the school in terms of raising funds and it would be a real shame to see it disappear. The school community needs to work together to keep it going.
- The summer fair is a very long day for those who help especially for set up and tidying at the end of the day
- I think it is lovely that the children get to make something for the summer fair that we can buy so if there was an option to do that if the fair day does not go ahead then that would be great
- Change to Fun Day not a fair!
- The numbers attending do seem to be dwindling, maybe the PTFA could consider lowering/capping the price of activities so that more families could attend. Current £1+ per 'go' can become prohibitively expensive, especially with multiple children.
- Perhaps it could be held after school like the winter bazaar so that volunteers don't have to give up their whole weekend to help.
- Enterprise week where children in their classes design and build a business and hold
 a selling event at the end such as selling ice cream Sundays/hot dog stalls, balloon
 popping competitions etc and all profits go to the school
- I worry about what I'm getting involved in if I sign up to help.
- If not many helpers, how about considering to provide some small incentives to each helper for more engagement? Or put helpers' names (whose mum/dad) on school newsletter as accomplishments?
- It takes a lot of energy & organisation but it makes the school look brilliant on the day.
- More discos throughout the year to raise money
- Get parents to pay an entry fee per head (adult and child) but also do a family ticket. Then people can bring a picnic (good chance to encourage people to stay for the afternoon) and organise a big summer fun day with bouncy castles (pay per go), inflatables, bbq stands (burgers, hotdogs) where people can buy food and drink. Also, could have pony rides, face painters etc Make an afternoon of it rather than stalls only. Think would be better to make it an event with lots going on and live music, rather than a fair which I think as you do the Christmas one covers that off.
- The fair is one of the highlights of the year
- It would be a real shame for the children to not have some sort of summer celebration. But I understand it is hard to get parents on board to help. Some positive changes have been made in the last few months to simplify and automate the way the PTFA runs certain events.
- Can be inside or outside depending on the weather.

- maybe open up to local clubs such as guiding/sporting/drama clubs etc. so they can use it as advertising but they also host activities.
- Perhaps the school needs to understand *why* there is only the same small group of organisers. Perhaps this existing group doesn't create a very welcoming/inclusive/friendly space where other parents feel their ideas are appreciated, heard and can contribute?
- I find it hard to commit to the committee due to my work/shift commitments however I am always happy and do volunteer my time at the events. I appreciate it always seems to be the same parents committing and volunteering. We are all very grateful for the hard work the PTFA do in organising and supporting these events/ the children and the school.
