PE and Sports Premium Funding

In the academic year 2023 – 2024, Chipstead Valley Primary received £21,390.

The table below shows how this funding was spent:

Amount	Spent On	Impact
£140	Competitions- This enables children to enter competitions across the Croydon area and beyond, on a regular basis.	These competitions offer children across the school the opportunity to represent their school. The competitions entered are from a range of sports and are purposely chosen to ensure a large number of children are able to thrive, thus ensuring enjoyment for all.
£714	Playground equipment- For all years to use at break and lunchtime.	The enhancement of playground equipment enables children to explore and develop their skills, in a fun, safe environment where there are no pressures from a formal lesson situation. Embedding the ethos of sport being fun.
£4036	Curriculum Schemes and development- We continue to use the imoves PE scheme, all teaching staff are able to follow, to ensure consistency across the school. In addition, we have purchased equipment, staff training and planning resources for the teaching of Quidditch within the curriculum.	This had been previously introduced and becoming more embedded across the school. This holistic scheme for PE is to ensure that PE is enjoyable for all pupils. The scheme will teach the fundamentals that all children will need to apply to a range of sports and with set lessons and assessments it will mean that teaching is consistent across the school.
£12,000	Additional Swimming – part funding of additional swimming provision for all years groups	All children from reception to year 6 take part in weekly swimming lessons enabling a very high proportion of children to not only meet but also exceed the 25 metre primary swimming target. A high percentage of children are additionally able to access competitive swimming.
£4500	Sports Coaching - funded specialist coaches to develop increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport	Teacher confidence increased and improved level of PE teaching and sports provision throughout the school
